It is our aim to develop pupils' positive attitudes to learning, that can be reflected across the curriculum. Lesson planning and delivery is based on high expectations for all pupils where every learner is given opportunities to succeed. Children to become more active and support health and wellbeing. All children participate in 2 hours of PE per week. An increased number of children walking/riding/scooting to school, encouraging children to undertake 60 minutes of physical activity per day.
