

Our key texts

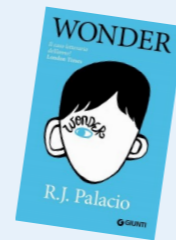
Maths: In maths this half term we will consolidate our learning from Year 6 and KS2 in preparations from high school. We will be taking part in maths projects which are designed to explore maths in real life contexts, allowing children to see how important maths is in all aspects of life. As well as this we will be ensuring we make maths fun for this last half term by ensuring there are cross curricular links, for example, tasks that develop design and technology skills and geographical knowledge.

Science: – In Science we are learning all about Making connections: Are some sunglasses safer than others? We will be testing light and UV transmission of different sunglasses through an enquiry to decide which pair work best. Before recapping our learning of Science from across KS2.

Art: In art we will be looking at sculpture and 3D: Making memories. This unit teaches children to create expressive sculptures and reflect on artistic decisions. We will learn to represent memories through art, using various materials and techniques.

Computing: We will finish off our current unit on Big Data before moving on to our new unit — skills showcase— inventing a product. Children will have the opportunity to invent their own electronic product.

French: We will be looking at visiting a town in France following on from our holiday planning last half term. We will describe routes to school, follow simple directions, describe the relationship between places using a prepositions, put modes of transport into a simple sentence, role-play buying tickets in French.

How can I support my child?

Please continue to ensure your child reads regularly (at least three times per week). Homework is set each Friday to be returned the following Thursday. Please encourage your child to complete this. Don't forget optional activities for Maths and spelling are available on EdShed.

Music: We will have Mr Brown for this half term focusing on preparing us for our leavers assembly and end of year production. He will be helping us choose our songs and perfecting them ready to perform.

PSHE: We are focussing on preparing for high school and most of our PSHE this half term will be around transition sessions. We will also look at our identity and the factors which make this.

English: In English we are focusing on the narrative text— Wonder which we are reading in guided reading. As our main focus this half term is writing we will be using this text to widen our writing opportunities. We will be practicing writing formally and informally and using KS2 key grammar skills such as using cohesion, dialogue to convey characters and structure for effect. We will write for narrative purposes such as recounts, retelling of the story and non fiction purposes such as biographies, letters and reports. We will also focus on the speaking and listening strand of the curriculum when preparing for our end of year performance.

Geography: In Geography we will be focusing on the question— Can I carry out an independent fieldwork enquiry? We will be pulling all of our fieldwork skills together including using our map reading skills, using the best method of data collection, map data digitally using Digi maps which we are becoming more confident with. We will explore our local environment to be able to carry out our enquiries.

RE: In this unit we will be looking at the question—What place does religion have in our world today? We will explore the place of religion personally, locally, nationally and globally using and referring to our prior knowledge to explore this question.

PE: In PE we will be perfecting our skills at athletics and cricket. We will hopefully be enjoying the weather by taking our PE lessons on the field and finding out which athletic event is our favourite.
